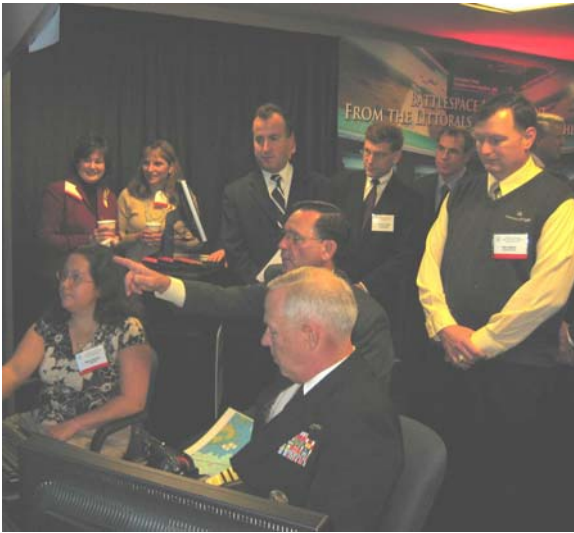

LCS Simulator Goes to Surface Navy Association Symposium in Arlington
